## THE GENESIS

Established on 21st August, 1958, Manipur College, the third oldest premier college in the state, is a full-fledged co-educational government college having undergraduate programmes leading to B.A. and B.Sc. Degree. The college has an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) prescribing quality benchmark for every academic, administrative and co-curricular activity in and off the campus, introducing various innovative measures to streamline teaching-learning and other activities so that quality is assured and ensured. Feedbacks are obtained from students and stakeholders for improving the quality of the College. This college was accredited with 'B' grade in the year 2007 and has been reaccredited in the year 2013 (Cycle -2) with 'B' Grade by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), Bangalore.

With the motto : "Learning is for freedom", the college envisioned to grow into a multi-disciplinary study centre for academic excellence. The college is now striving with a mission to produce competent graduates in the field of science, social science and humanities to meet the manpower needs of the country, to help our youths develop their potential to the fullest extent by cultivating right interests, attitudes, moral, intellectual, aesthetic, socio-economic values, by physical fitness and disseminating scientific knowledge, and to foster among the students the attitudes and values needed for developing good life-styles.

## LIBRARY

The College Library donated by Shri N. Jadu Singh, under the name of Bhagavan Shri Krishna Library in 1970, has a vast collection of over 20,000 books on matters of common interest and different subjects taught in the College. All the available books of the Library and Departmental Library books have been computerised using SOUL-2 software. The Library operates on an 'Open Access' system. The Library subscribes to over 30 periodicals and popular magazines and newspapers both national and state. Library staff members look after the Library under the strict supervision of Library Advisory Committee.

The College is accessed to N-LIST (Inflib-Net) facilities through which more than 51,000 e-Text books and 2100 Foreign and National Journals (both Science & Arts) are available for research work or any advanced study through internet Broadband penetration through NME-ICT connections available in the College.

Moreover, the College has been selected as one of the centres for EDU-SAT under which all the classrooms will be connected with all classroom activities of other institutions of the world through modern ICT system.





## CAREER COUNSELLING AND GUIDANCE CELL

The college has a Career Counselling and Guidance Cell, which has been successfully organising various consultation programmes/functions, etc. in connection with students' future academic career and other career opportunities. Information are available in the form of career oriented newspaper, magazines, and through internet, etc. People from outside the college who are expert in different fields and professions are also invited occasionally to give lecture/talk and guidance to young students concerning their further academic career/studies within and outside the state after their graduation.

## NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

To involve the students in social and various developmental activities and to develop their personality through community services and above all National Integration, the college is having two units of National Service Scheme (NSS), one for boys and another for girls. NSS volunteers are given opportunity to participate in the youth related camps, festivals, adventure course etc. at the state, regional and national level every year. Not less than five Regular Programmes in addition to one Special Programme (residential Camp at the adopted village) are conducted every year to make the volunteers aware of their moral, intellectual and social responsibilities to the society.

## COURSES OF STUDY AND COURSE STRUCTURE

Each course of B.A. or B.Sc. (Honours and General) is of 3 (three) year duration. There shall be 6 (six) semesters for each course. The college offers both Honours and General Degree courses. Both the students offering Honours and General Course have the same course structure from semester-I to semester -IV. In each of the semesters — I to semester-IV, there will be 3 (three) elective subjects and 1 (one) compulsory foundation course (FC) paper.

A student offering Honours Course will have 3 (three) Honours Papers of a particular subject, [but 4 (four) hon. papers in case of Chemistry] in each semester V and Semester VI. The Honours Subject shall be one of the elective subjects offered by the student in the previous semesters (semester-I to semester-IV).

A student offering general Course will continue to offer the same three elective subjects offered in the previous semesters (semester-I to semester-IV) in semester-V and semester-VI.

Each semester of the first 2 (two) years i.e. Semester - I, Semester - II, Semester - III and Semester - IV for both Honours and General Courses shall have four papers :

1 (one) paper on foundation course : MIL (MAN)/General English (GEN) in semester I and Semester - II, Regional Development (RD) in Semester - III and Environmental Studies (EVS) in Semester -IV

Any 3 (three) Papers from the following elective subjects provided that the student should not fail in the 10+2 Examination in the subject offered

- (a) Economics (b) Education (c) English (d) Geography
- (e) History (f) Manipuri (g) Mathematics (h) Philosophy
- (i) Political Science

### **B.A. (HONOURS COURSE) : Semester - V to Semester - VI**

A student offering Honours Course in semester - V and Semester - VI has to choose any one elective subject offered in Semester - I to Semester - IV

### **B.A. (GENERAL COURSE) : Semester - V to Semester - VI**

A student offering General Course will continue to offer the same three elective subjects offered in the previous semesters (Semester - I to Semester - IV) in Semester - V and Semester - VI



## SCHEME OF EXAMINATION

### 1. Semester Examination

There shall be a University examination at the end of each semester in accordance with the guidelines of the Manipur University. Classified eligibility of a student to appear at the semester examination shall be governed by the following criteria.

- (a) A student who has appeared at the first semester examination may be allowed to attend second semester classes immediately after he/she has appeared at the first semester examination and also allowed to appear second semester examination irrespective of any number of back papers one has.
- (b) A student who has appeared at the second semester examination may be allowed to attend third semester classes immediately after he/she has appeared at the second semester examination and also allowed to appear third semester examination.
- (c) A student who has appeared at the third semester examination may be allowed to attend fourth semester classes immediately after he/she has appeared at the third semester examination and will be allowed to appear fourth semester examination provided that the maximum number of back papers will be four from the first, second and third semester examinations taken together.
- (d) A student who has appeared at the fourth semester examination may be allowed to attend fifth semester classes immediately after he/she has appeared at the fourth semester examination and will be allowed to appear fifth semester examination.
- (e) A student who has appeared at the fifth semester examination may be allowed to attend sixth semester classes immediately after he/she has appeared at the fifth semester examination and will be allowed to appear sixth semester examination if provided that the maximum number of back papers will be four from the third, fourth and fifth semester examinations taken together.
- (f) A student who has passed all the six semesters in regular attempt shall be placed in the class "Honours with Distinction" if he/she secured at least 85% marks in aggregate in Honours subject in all the semesters.

### 2. Internal Examination

In each semester there will be Internal Examinations in different forms, conducted by the college, in compliance with the guidelines of the Manipur University.

## ADMISSION PROCEDURE

### (a) Mode of Admission

Application for admission to B.A./B.Sc. Course should be made in prescribed form which is issued by the college along with the Information Bulletin made available to the applicants on payment of Rs. 250/- for Arts and Rs. 300/- for Science.

Admission will be granted as per the rules framed by the Admission Committee.



**(b) Eligibility**

Candidates seeking admission to B.A./B.Sc. 1st Semester should have passed Higher Secondary Examination conducted by the Council of Higher Secondary Education, Manipur or any other equivalent examination recognized by the Manipur University with a minimum of 45% in aggregate for both science and Arts.

**(c) Reservation of Seats and Relaxation of Marks**

Seats are reserved for SC, ST, son/daughter of ex-servicemen, differently abled students and students with outstanding performance in the field of Games & Sports and Arts & Culture as per the State Government rules. A relaxation of 5% marks from the cut-off marks will be given to the students having NCC "B" Certificate or NSS Certificate, and those belonging to SC, ST, OBCs, Minorities, Differently Abled, Sports Persons of eminence and sons or daughters of Demean.

**(d) Documents to be enclosed**

- (i) One attested Photostat copy of Mark Sheet & Provisional Certificate of the XII/Equivalent Examination.
- (ii) One attested Photostat copy of HSLC Mark Sheet.
- (iii) One attested Photostat copy of the Admit Card of the HSLC Examination showing the age of the applicant.
- (iv) 4 copies of recently taken passport size photograph of the applicant (not stamp size).
- (v) A Character Certificate (Original) from the Head of the Institute last attended.
- (vi) One attested Photostat copy of Caste/Tribe Certificate from the DC/SDO concerned, if applicable.
- (vii) One attested Photostat copy of OBC certificate issued by the concerned authority for relaxation of marks and other admissible benefits as per rules, if applicable.
- (viii) Lower income certificate (in original) from the concerned authority to enjoy exemption of tuition fees for students belonging to the economically backward group.
- (ix) One attested Photostat copy of a relevant certificate from the concerned authority for the differently abled applicants.
- (x) One attested copy of sports/NCC/NSS/Ex-service man certificate, if applicable.
- (xi) Applicants who passed the qualifying examination from other Board/ Council/ University should submit migration certificate within three months after admission.

**10. College Scholarships, Awards and Medals**

**1. N. Angoubi Devi Scholarship for Academic Excellence**

Two scholarships for academic merit carrying cash awards of Rs. 2,500/- each are awarded annually to the First Class Topper (Regular) of the college in the B.A. and B.Sc. III Year Examination. A certificate of merit is also awarded along with the cash prize.

**2. N. Angoubi Devi Scholarship for Sports Talent**

The Scholarship carries a cash prize of Rs. 2,500/-. Students of Manipur College who have won the 1st/2nd/3rd Position in National Level Team/Individual Competitions or in the National Level Inter-University Competitions (Team/Individual) are eligible to claim this scholarship. Shri N. Jadu Singh in memory of his mother Late N. Angoubi Devi sponsored the two scholarships.

**3. A. Tolen Singh Memorial Gold Medal for Academic Merit**

The Gold Medal sponsored by Shrimati Arambam Ibeton Devi in memory of her son (Late) A. Tolen Singh who was the Secretary Social & Culture, Manipur College Students' Union, is awarded to a student who tops the list of First Divisioner of Manipur College in the B.A./B.Sc. III year Mathematics (Hons) Examination. A certificate of merit is also awarded along with the Gold Medal.



#### 4. L. Shyamasakhi Devi Memorial Award

One scholarship for academic merit carrying cash award of Rs. 2,500/- is awarded annually to the B.Sc. III year (Regular) who secures highest mark in Botany Honours. A certificate of merit is awarded along with the cash prize. Dr. L. Jairaj Singh, Associate Professor in Botany, Manipur College in memory of his mother Late L. Shyamasakhi Devi, sponsored the award.

#### 5. Thokchom Parijat Singh and Thokchom Mani Singh Memorial Award.

An academic merit scholarship carrying a cash prize of Rs. 2,500/- is awarded annually to the B.A./B.Sc. III year student (Regular) who secures highest mark in Geography Honours. A certificate of merit is awarded along with the cash prize. Dr. Th. Joykumar Singh, Retd, Reader and the Head, Department of Geography has sponsored the award in memory of his parents.
